The following presents comments recorded by Bob Butera, Kurt Bauer, and Kristi Bischofberger during the October HDP public meetings:

- Why is there a rule that you must have paved driveways?
- There should be one person that you can go to and say “fix the problem”.
- Is on lot stuff just a band aid? (Response: It is one component of an integrated approach)
- If zoning is ineffective, then how will anything else work?
- Since the hillside will never vote for more taxes, we should just enforce at new development level.
- We should do a model drainage basin to show that this will work and use it to sell overall.
- Need to build roads to better standards to avoid icing.
- There was a request to look at drainage at Freedom and 131<sup>st</sup>. There is no place to drain the lowest lot without an easement across someone’s land.
- “I am not anti-development. What I would like to see if planned, thoughtfully implemented development taking into consideration the natural character of the land, resulting in as little adverse impact as possible”
- The plan should more strongly address water quality issues.
